QUESTIONS AND NOTES

What does it mean to praise? What does it mean to give praise to God?

Personal blessings v1-5

- Peter reminded us of the old answer to the question: what is the chief end of man and the answer is to worship God and enjoy him forever
 - Do we think of worship and enjoying Him as being our chief end
 - What other things can we make our chief end?
- Share personal blessings you have enjoyed in recent times and praise God for them
- In v2 we are called to 'forget not all his blessings'. What can it lead to if we do forget our blessings
- What do you find helpful to remind you of God's blessings? What might you need to change to ensure you are reminded of His blessings?
- Our greatest problem and need is for the forgiveness of sin. Why is this?
- v3 says God 'heals all your diseases'. Does this mean we should expect to be healed from all illness? If not how should we read this verse?

Collective Blessings V 6-18

- v6 says that 'The Lord works righteousness and justice for all the oppressed.' Dwell on why that is good news.

- God has removed our sin from us. The passage uses two images for this in v11-12. What are they and what impact do they have on us?
- Read v13-18 and reflect on what is revealed of God's character.
 - What is our response to that revelation?

Calling all creation to praise God v19-22

- Read these verses and summarise what it is saying
- What is our response to this?

Summarise and Apply

- What in this passage leads us to worship Jesus?
- What do we learn about ourselves from this passage? How does it lead us to give thanks or repent?
- How might this help us share the good news with our friends and neighbours who don't know Jesus?
