QUESTIONS AND NOTES

- In what different ways can the bible be doubted?
- What accusations were the opponents making against Paul?

We can trust Paul's gospel because it is from Jesus

- What arguments does Paul make to convince the Galatians that they can trust his gospel?
 - How can we see that Paul did not make up the gospel?
 - Read the passage and notice how often Paul mentions the apostles or Jerusalem.
 - What does he say about them?
 - Why does Paul make such an issue of this?
 - What do the apostles say about the gospel Paul has been preaching?
- Some people would say that the bible contradicts itself. How would you respond to this?
 - Sometimes at first glance parts of the bible seem to be saying different things. How should we respond to this?

• What is an apostle? Who are the apostles that wrote the bible? Why can we trust their record?

The gospel really is Good News

- What do we learn about the gospel from Pauls testimony?
 - How might Pauls testimony be helpful for us as we share our story with people?
- What do you learn about the gospel from Pauls meeting with the other apostles?
- What are the 'nice' and 'proper' attitudes that we might be tempted to add to belief in Christ as an expectation for other christians?
- Do you ever feel guilty or insecure in your relationship with God? What might this be telling you about how you view the gospel?
