# **QUESTIONS AND NOTES**

- What is the darkness for the people of God in the days of Isaiah? (See Isaiah 1:2; 1:4; 1:13; 1:16; 1:23; 2:6-8; 3:4-8; 3:16; 5:4; 5:11; 5:20-21; 7:1; 8:19-22)
  - Who or what is the cause of the darkness?
  - What darkness do we experience in the world around us and in individuals?
- What hope do we see in 9:1-7?
  - How does this hope come?
  - How can we be sure this baby is Jesus? (See Matt 4:12-17)
- What does the term wonderful counsellor bring to mind when you initially hear it?
  - Have a look to see how the word 'wonderful' is used in the bible.
    See Ex 15:11; Psalm 78:11-15; Isa 25:1
  - Have a look to see how the word 'counsellor' is used in the bible.
    See Samuel 17:7, 11, 15; 1 Chron 27:32-33; Isaiah 14:24-27; Psalm 32:8.
    The word might be translated as advice, planned, decide, purposed.

- With these in mind how does that help us understand the title 'Wonderful Counsellor'?
- Why would this be good news for those in Isaiah's time?
- Why is a wonderful counsellor good news for us today?
- How do we see Jesus as a wonderful counsellor in the gospels?
  - Think of how he understands people, how he speaks truth and how he helps.
  - Take particular stories and see how Jesus interacts with people.
    Eg Nicodemus (Jn 3:1-21) Sisters of Lazarus (Jn 11:17-37) Doubting Thomas (Jn 20:29)
- How do we interact with Jesus, our wonderful counsellor now?
  - o John 14:15-18; 16:12-15
- How can we respond to Jesus as our wonderful counsellor:
  - As individuals
  - o As a church
