REFLECTION

QUESTIONS AND NOTES

- Recap with one another what has happened so far in 1 Samuel.
- Read chapter 21:1-9
 - What strikes you from this passage?
 - What is Ahimelek's reaction to David arriving? Why do you think he has this reaction?
 - Read v2-6. Summarise what is being said by each person
 - Why do you think David is lying?
 - This passage doesn't directly address whether it was right or wrong for David to lie to Ahimelek. What do you think?
 - Is it ever right to lie? Why do you think that? What does the rest of the bible have to say on this? (See Exodus 1:17-21; Joshua 2:4-5 and Hebrews 11:31; Exodus 20:16; Col 3:9)
 - How might this inform both extreme situations such as people hiding Jews in the second world war, and normal everyday situations for us?

- Should David have had the consecrated bread?
 - See Leviticus 24:5-9. Who was to eat the bread?
 - The consecrated bread was to represent manna in the context of the people's exodus. How are there echoes of this in David's experience? What does this teach us about God's provision? How does God provide for us in our times of need?
 - Read Luke 6:1-5. What does Jesus' interpretation of this teach us?
 - Ahimelek might not have given the bread to most people.
 Why might he have given it to David (see 1 Sam 10:3-4)
- Read the rest of chapter 21 and 22.
 - How did the Spirit speak to you through this passage?
 - Where do we see this passage pointing forward to Jesus?
 - Where were you encouraged or challenged?
